Key indicator 1: The engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school pupils undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school.

All children have 2 hours of structured P.E. lessons per week. With our running track, classes use this regularly to complete Golden Mile sessions. We have a good selection of active clubs available after school. We also have set days for organised lunchtime clubs and after school clubs. Active lunchtimes are promoted throughout the school with a large range of equipment readily available.
