Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school pupils undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school.

All children have 2 hours of structured P.E. lessons per week. With our running track, classes use this regularly to complete Golden Mile sessions. We have a good selection of active clubs available after school and within the school enrichment programme. We also have set days for organised lunchtime clubs and after school clubs. Active lunchtimes are promoted throughout the school with a large range of equipment readily available.
